Stop 1

FIRST HOSPITAL IN WABASH COUNTY

654 W Hill St, Wabash

Originally built in 1889 as an orphanage by local builder Joseph Hipskind and in 1903 became the first hospital in Wabash County. In 1930, the local women used it as a place to meet & have programs. Click [HERE](#) for more!

Stop 2

BURIED TIME CAPSULE

800 W Hill St, Wabash

Just off of the Hill Street entrance of the Wabash City Park is a raised concrete platform with a collection of memories. Snap a photo and tag #VisitWabashCounty.

Stop 3

AUTOBOT B-127

1750 Mill St, Wabash

Traveling 8,000 miles from Thailand to Wabash, Indiana, Bumble Bee is made completely out of scrap metal. There are more statues just like him. Can you find them all?

Stop 4

CLUPPER HOUSE

541 N Miami St, Wabash

Ever hear of the architectural term "jerkinhead gables"? Unusual to Wabash is this 1910 English Vernacular style house. Cyril & Ruth Clupper lived in the home 1973 - 1998.

Stop 5

NEARLY 150-YEAR OLD BRIDGE

6000 Roann Lukens Lake Rd, Roann

Built in 1877 measuring 288 feet long and 15 feet wide, this historic structure was set on fire by an arsonist in 1990. Today, it has been completely restored. Click [HERE](#) to read more!

BUILT BY THE IRISH

610 Washington St, Lagro

Built in the 1830s by mainly Irish immigrants, this historic spot has been credited as one of the reasons Indiana became a state. Click [HERE](#) to read more!

4552 E Hanging Rock Rd, Lagro
