The Lincoln Monument of Wabash, Indiana or The Great Emancipator is a public sculpture by Charles Keck. The cast bronze sculpture was commissioned by Wabash-native Alexander New and donated in 1932.

The bronze sculpture was created by John M. Soderberg, PH D. It represents Mr. Honeywell's desire to provide culture to the youth of Wabash County.

### 1733 S Wabash St, Wabash
